Executive Summary

This project takes the form of a series of events and meetings with the various components of Tunisian civil society and local authorities with the aim of communicating on the SPAMI of the Galite archipelago and more generally on what the SPAMIs are to enhance its natural, cultural and historical heritage.

Indeed, the Galite archipelago is a specific ecosystem for Tunisia and the Mediterranean characterized by an important biological, cultural and historical wealth. It is home to emblematic, endemic and other threatened animal and plant species. In addition, the history of the Galite archipelago, its richness and the objectives aimed at making it a real gateway to nature in the Mediterranean must be communicated more intensely.

1. Introduction

The SPAMI Day, a **regional celebration of Mediterranean marine conservation and protected areas**, was set up by the Contracting Parties to the Barcelona Convention at their COP 22 (Antalya, Türkiye, 7-10 December 2021), and is officially celebrated on 15 April of each year.

The objective of the SPAMI Day is to promote the List of **Specially Protected Areas of Mediterranean Importance** (SPAMIs), in other words, exceptional marine areas, managed in an exemplary manner, and more broadly, to raise awareness about ocean conservation.

The theme of SPAMI Day 2023 focused on the co-management and involvement of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in the management of Marine and Coastal Protected Areas (MCPAs). By selecting this theme, the aim was to value and encourage all the dynamics involving different stakeholders within SPAMIs, which contribute to transformative change towards preserving and restoring ecosystems and living in harmony with nature.

As part of the third edition of the SPAMI Twinning Programme, funded by the Italian Ministry of Environment and Energy Security, SPA/RAC provided support to Mediterranean Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) in implementing activities to celebrate the SPAMI Day and promote the conservation of marine biodiversity accross six SPAMIs, in collaboration with their respective managers.

In this context, the mini project "La Galite Archipelago: a jewel of the Mediterranean, a SPAMI to preserve" was proposed and implemented by Association Méditerranée Action Nature (MAN) in collaboration with the Tunisian Coastal Protection and Planning Agency (APAL).

The aim of this mini project was to raise awareness of La Galite Archipelago as a Specially Protected Area of Mediterranean Importance (SPAMI) and emphasize the need for its conservation. The project aimed also to engage a network of actors and advocates committed to the sustainable management of SPAMIs in Tunisia and the Mediterranean.

2. Presentation of the Association Méditerranée Action Nature (MAN)

The Mediterranean Action Nature association has emerged from a reflection since 2015 of a group of experts and managers working on the creation and management of MPAs / AMCPs in Tunisia and in the Mediterranean and working for the conservation of coastal biodiversity and coastal.

- Contribution to environmental management at the level of protected natural areas, in particular island areas and more generally on the coast.
- Contribution to capacity building, training of stakeholders in environmental management, environmental protection and conservation of coastal, coastal and island biodiversity (Naturalists, amateurs, experts, etc.).

5.3. Environmental education at a primary school

Short description of the activity and its objectives.

The MAN association, in partnership with APAL, the official manager of the ASPIM de la Galite, organizes a series of environmental education sessions each year in public or private primary schools.

As a continuation of these activities, organized an environmental education session for the students of a primary school in Bizerte (Gustave Eiffel School). The main objective of this action is to introduce them to the SPAMI and raise their awareness of the importance of its protection and the conservation of its biological diversity.

Before the day of the activity, the pupils of the environment club of the Gustave effeil school were invited to carry out research on the AMCP in general and then on the AMCP of Galite specifically.

The main objective of the activity is to define a SPAMI and detail the characteristics of an area classified as SPAMI.

During the activity, each student presented his work and then a discussion was led by all the participants. The students were very excited and presented their work with great pride.

5.4. Field school

Short description of the activity and its objectives.

This action consists of a field trip for a group of schoolchildren who participated in the environmental education session.

In this context, the MAN association has organized an outing to Sidi Mechreg, the closest land area to La Galite and which will allow participants to observe the Galite archipelago with the naked eye or with binoculars, which is visible at this level. Visitors are installed at the station "Eco Rand Sidi Mechreg" which is reserved in advance to host the event.

For this activity, the MAN association acquired observation equipment consisting of two binoculars and a telescope which were used by all participants.

This activity allowed the students to see the real structure of the archipelago and the different islets that make it up and make a comparison with everything that was presented theoretically, especially the comparison with the educational model of Galite designed by the co-management unit.

5.5. Information Day at the Faculty of Sciences, Tunis El Manar

It is an opportunity to integrate into the academic world and talk to students about SPAMIs, their natural importance but also their roles in promoting cooperation for the preservation of biodiversity in the Mediterranean. The SPAMI of Galite has set the standard example for this theme, especially since the co-management unit has integrated, since last year, several student researchers who are currently working on Galite and who will testify to their experiences.

Several researchers (active or retired teachers) who have worked on Galite are invited to speak to the students about the specificity of this SPAMI and biodiversity and their experiences during their field missions.
